NEWS FROM YEAR 2/3/4

Years 2,3 and 4 have been busy at it again this term. With sustainability and the environment as a theme across all subjects, we have engaged in many practical and fun activities to expand our understanding of the world around us.

One of our favourite activities was making a water filter and experimenting with different materials as the filter. Then, we tipped dirty water (Miss Rivers had a lot of fun making sludge water using the year 4 boys tractor scoopers) into the plastic water bottles and observed whether the water changed colour as it trickled out into a cup.

We recorded our findings and discussed the importance of a fair test. We learnt the importance of clear water and watched videos of some countries in Africa that struggle to find fresh water. We are very lucky to live in Australia with safe, clean drinking water.
